



Interim Pastor's Column

Right now, even though we are right in the middle of the Epiphany Season, lots of my ideas and energy are focused on the coming of Lent. Even so, we are, right this very moment, still in the middle of winter—not my favorite season of the year here in Maryland.

So I need to read Psalm 139. Indeed, more and more, I am drawn to this text...this prayer of David. Even though I say, "I am drawn to this text..." that doesn't necessarily mean that I allow this prayer to envelope or embrace me. Often when I read it—and I probably do read this Psalm more than any other scripture in the whole Bible—I experience a deep sense of calm and quiet...a deep sense of longing and yearning. Even though this psalm is titled, "The Inescapable God," I still find myself resisting its claim on me.

I am tempted to continue this column **without** actually sharing any of the words from Psalm 139—just hoping you will be intrigued enough to open your Bible and read it all for yourself—but that would seem to be a ploy that distracts from the point I want to make. Thus, I share the opening words of Psalm 139: "**O Lord, you have searched me and known me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; You discern my thoughts from far away.**" It is interesting that in "The Message," Peterson offers this translation: "God, investigate my life...I am open to you; even from a distance, you know what I am thinking."

Indeed, in these changing days from winter to spring, my thoughts, my concerns, my interests, my passions are all just about as scattered as the colors of spring that will soon start popping up here and there. Sometimes to the point of being overwhelmed, **I am intrigued** by many different aspects of the "life and culture" of the Manchester community and of Trinity Church. Your leadership structure; the hope that you will be able to reverse the decline you've experienced; the role you could play in the neighborhoods right around the church and in the larger area or region of Carroll County; the generosity of the mission and outreach efforts of the church; and how you experience worship, etc..

I am anguished over many different situations in this chaotic world: The Endless wars in the middle East, especially those the U.S. conducts; the loss of civility in our public and political affairs; the sometimes chaotic life that wearies my friends in Honduras; the daily fear children of immigrant families who live within our community and our country; the challenging impact aging and declining health has on our lives, etc..

I am searching for deeper understanding of emerging theologies offered by writers like Marcus Borg, Robin Meyers, Barbara Brown Taylor, John Spong; etc.. What do these mean for my own personal theology and how do I interpret them for the practice of discipleship in the church? etc..

With all this, **I am hopeful** for our church and for what is still in store for us in the Easter season that comes with God raising Jesus to new life, which raises us to the gift of the living Christ in our lives. The psalmist says in verses 5-6 these profound yet comforting words: "**You hem me in, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain it.**" Can you imagine the hope and comfort we have in the truth and promise that God lays God's hand on us. Wow!!

And then I read the closing verses of Psalm 139: "**How mighty to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them—they are more than the sand; I come to the end – I am still with you.**" What an awesome assurance...in spite of and in the midst of all the chaos, stimulations, challenges, and confusions of this world, we hear, "**I am still with you.**"

I pray you will seek out this psalm for your own reflection and support in these interesting days. I would love to hear your thoughts, your intrigues, your anguish, your searching.


