

Silent Reflection:

<u>Pastor:</u> Innocent people are being destroyed by the whims of the wicked. The Coronavirus attacks us from all fronts – all over the world.

Silent Reflection:

<u>Pastor:</u> We turn an indifferent ear to the cries of others, often because we are so overwhelmed by the needs and feel helpless in the face of such chaos. We close our eyes. We walk away, often crossing over to the side of self-importance and indifference because we are afraid to become involved.

Silent Reflection:

<u>Pastor:</u> For over years and decades, we watched and sometimes, in knowing and unknowing ways, shared in the implicit bias of racism. In these days, we try more than ever to become the anti-racist person Jesus calls us to be.

Silent Reflection:

<u>Pastor:</u> Our society is quick to sue and slow to heal. We succumb to those pressures in our fear. Help us, O Lord. Heal our spirits as well as our bodies. Open our hearts and our eyes to see you, O Christ, that we may be empowered to service rather than apathy.

Silent Reflection:

<u>Pastor:</u> Forgive us, Lord, forgive us. Make us ready to truly become your disciples. For we ask these things in Jesus' name. **AMEN.**
