Affirmation of Ministry

For some people today, even those who profess Christ and seek to follow Jesus, the 'Dark' is an enemy, an ever-challenging space to encounter.

The profound, encouraging, and challenging words of the Psalmist in Psalms 139:12

("...even the darkness is not dark to you; the night is as bright

as the day, for darkness is as light to you.")

can both invite us to open ourselves to god's light when we are afraid in the dark and 'smack' us gently to awaken our spiritual gifts and resources that allow us to see God's 'safety-net' in the night.

This five-sermon series will challenge and inspire us to "Come and See God;" to allow God to soothe our fears in the darkness; and to discover how the light can add brilliance and vitality to our lives.-- Pastor Gerry Hanberry
