Scripture Lesson for February 21, 2021 – Lent 1

Introduction to the Hebrew Lesson:

The lesson from the first book in the Bible, Genesis 9:8-17, is all about Covenant, God's Covenant with Noah and his sons. Covenants involve relationships, binding relationships between God and others. In our own relationships in the church are at least 4-way covenants: God, the local church, the Catoctin Association and the larger bodies of the UCC. Covenants are designed to renew, to reconcile and to set a promise (s) for the future. Listen to a reading from Genesis:

A Reading from Genesis 9:8-17

⁸ Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, ⁹ "As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, 10 and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. [a] 11 I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth." ¹² God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: 13 I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. ¹⁴ When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, ¹⁵ I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. ¹⁶ When the bow is in the clouds. I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth." ¹⁷ God said to Noah, "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth."

Introduction: The Gospel Lesson Matthew 5:1-3

In this Lenten season we are exploring the Beatitudes in Matthew chapter 5. Pairing a Beatitude with the regular scriptures of the Revised Common Lectionary, we will find the blessings in these scriptures and in our lives. Listen to the first three verses of Matthew 5:

Gospel Lesson: Matthew 5:1-3 Blessed are the Poor in Spirit

The Beatitudes:

5 When Jesus^[a] saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. ² Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying: ³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
