### **TUCC Current COVID Protocol**

The Consistory approved the following new Covid protocol:

Vaccinated persons may take their mask off once seated and practicing social distancing during services. It is recommended masks shall be worn at all other times including when entering and exiting church. We will stop taking temperatures but will continue gathering contact information and hand sanitizing.

The side entry doors will remain locked during service; front door will be left open. Any child leaving sanctuary during service is to be accompanied by adult.

Dear Ones,

I am one who believes in the messages of Psalm 139, including that God is with us wherever we are. Sure, we come to church on Sunday to worship God, but God is no less in the little things of daily life than the big things of the Sunday worship service. Most often, though, I think we look for God in the usual places when we'd do better to expand our vision. God is bigger than the tiny boxes we like to try to keep God in.

Time and again throughout scripture, we are told that God cannot be kept in under a roof and needs no house to be built in God's honor. When Peter wanted to build three tents (one for each Jesus, Elijah, and Moses), the text tells us "He did not know what he was saying." As if the very idea of housing God was preposterous. Then God's voice came down from the cloud to indicate the significance of that moment: it wasn't about any kind of shelter: it was about seeing Jesus for who he really is (Luke 9:28-36). Jesus as God made flesh had no need for shelter; he had work to do and they needed to listen to and follow him. Whether we're in a church or on the top of a mountain, we must remember that there is no where we can go that God is not. This includes the world around us—even in popular culture.

As I write this column, I am in the midst of planning our August worship series, "August at the Movies: Superhero Edition." This series is close to my heart. I have been a "film buff" since I was a little girl, drawn to the movies of such Hollywood titans as Audrey Hepburn and Carey Grant. I remember visits to my grandparents' house over the summer when Grandma would make sure she took us to see a movie or two. Not only that, but we nearly always watched a movie at home in the evenings after a wonderful dinner. Movies are what got me through four months of missed school in my sophomore year of high school. Needless to say, movies are a passion of mine.

Because they tell stories, motion pictures have the power to evoke powerful emotions in us. They can make us laugh ourselves silly, scare us, move us to tears, and inspire us beyond measure. Movies, it seems, have a lot in common with sermons. Pastors are essentially story tellers, working with the Holy Spirit to offer a meaningful word of hope and often call to action the congregation who is listening. A sermon series based on movies, then, seems only natural. It also sounds interesting, to me at least, and I hope you will find it to be so as well.

If we can find God in on the mountain top, in the clouds, in the church, and in the smiles that light up our children's faces, then we can find God in our entertainment, too.

So, I hope you will join us as we explore biblical themes as we see them throughout movies, and this year, as we see them in the Superhero genres. Come hear what Wonder Woman, Captain America, Guardians of the Galaxy, The Avengers, and The X-men have to do with our faith and how we can find God in unexpected places.

I hope to see you then! In the meantime, I hope you will look for God in all places and thank God for the beauty of the life you are so blessed to live.


