"Groundhog Day"

"While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and went with them, but their eyes were kept from recognizing him... When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him..." -from Luke 24:13-35

The film *Groundhog Day*, is a beloved one from my childhood growing up in Pennsylvania where Groundhog Day, the holiday, was such a big deal. Many of you have no doubt seen the 1993 Bill Murray classic, in which a TV weatherman finds himself caught in a time-loop, waking up to face the same day over and over again. Perhaps that's how we feel right now, in this strange time as we face a new variant and see that restrictions are beginning to resurface. Maybe we feel a bit like Bill Murray's character, Phil, waking up to relive the same day again and losing hope. "It's like déjà vu all over again," as Yogi Berra famously said.

In this time, we might find ourselves discouraged much like the disciples on the road to Emmaus. Their lives, like ours, had been turned upside-down, first by the teachings of Jesus and then by his death and resurrection. Only up to this point, they had not seen for themselves the risen Christ. The crucifixion shook the very foundations of what they believed in and had counted on. It happened quickly, much too quickly for them to process and understand.

But what they find along the way is that even in their struggle, they are not alone. Their struggle will unite them, it will bring them together around a life-changing message that they will carry into the world. God did not abandon them in their grief or their confusion, but gave them what they needed to get by.

Like the disciples, we are in the midst of struggle as this pandemic continues in our communities and around the world. Like the disciples, we face uncertainty in ways we had not imagined years ago. Every day feels curiously like *Groundhog Day* and at the same time, like something we've never faced before. And, like the disciples, we get to choose how we respond to it. We can let it unite us around love of neighbor and newfound appreciation for what parts of "life as we knew it" we have back. Or, we can let it divide us around questions of politics and frustration. We can choose the wisdom which tells us to proceed in hope and love our neighbors by doing the most caring thing. Or, we can charge forward in callous disregard for the life God holds sacred.

It gets better for Bill Murray's character in the film, but only once he lets go of his despair and resolves to use his days wisely. Like him and like the disciples headed to Emmaus, we can choose to spend these Groundhog Days of our lives withdrawn in bitterness and despair or we can decide to spend our time doing what we can, with the resources available to us, to do good where we are. Let us choose the loving way and stumble across Jesus in our midst. Even as we move through the ongoing gloom and doom around us, let us work so that the only thing we experience again is the surely of waking up knowing that God is good and loving and with us.



August 2021 Consistory Meeting Highlights

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jessica continues her outreach with members and community engagement with morning devotionals and planning details for "Let Us Pray for You Ministry." She is planning future vesper service in August, VBS, confirmation classes and materials, possible fall Bible Study on "Justice for Christians", and other fall and advent Bible studies. She will also contact other groups such as New Life For Girls to share taped music.

Treasurer's report: July report was reviewed and accepted. Sue Myers reported total checking accounts balance of \$81,000. The Endowment checking has \$54,000 due to the cash out of a CD. The Endowment committee is looking to place \$30,000-\$40,000 of that amount into T. Rowe Price to earn more. Sue projected that we will run \$55,000 short of meeting our budget for this year as offering remains down. A discussion was held about holding a stewardship campaign. We will send out a 6-month statement to urge people to give.

Property: Robert Miller reported our parking lot was relined at no cost by the landlord of the neighbors.

Finance: No Report

Evangelism: We discussed upkeep of the Little Free Library.

Christian Education: Leslie Brooks reported Children's Church began on August 1st and will continue on the first and third Sundays. She and Amy Shultz will share leadership along with Lexi Lawson or Pam Marchand assisting. Rocky Railway VBS begins August 10th. One of the activities will be starting a community rock garden.

Worship: The committee helped organize Sunday services including Communion on July 4 and August 1. Worship in the Park was held on July25th. Vesper Service was canceled on July 29th due to severe weather / tornado watch.

We stayed on track despite an ongoing heat wave and booming thunderstorms as we gathered each evening.

Each evening started off with a KidVid video and a bible story from Pastor Jessica.

We got wristbands to remind us to watch for God. The Rainbow after the Storm was a God sighting for all.

5 stars went to the snack time where all enjoyed Coal Crunch, Good friend fruit Pizza and Pretzel creations.

We all donated with our offering enough to support 3 alpacas and their families through the Kid-to-Kid Mission – Alpacas for Ecuador.

Everyone loved the games Noodle Relay, Alpaca Feet and Hover Ball.

MB provided musical instruments for all to play along with the songs. Mr. Jeff put the tape upside down on the bottom of the alpaca feet and they stuck to the carpet creating lots of giggles and "crunchy Feet"

At the end of the Worship Service on Sunday August 15, the VBS youth and others from Children's Church performed the signs and actions to the song "Same Power" as the final hymn. They did a magnificent finale.

Coal Crunch Recipe

- 3 cups mini marshmallows (Most marshmallows are allergy-friendly, but check ingredient lists to watch for things like wheat, milk, eggs, and if they may contain traces of peanuts.)
- 1½ tablespoons butter (To make a dairy-free version, simply use a vegan butter such as the options offered by the Earth Balance brand. This brand also offers a tasty vegan soy-free option if you need to stay away from soy.
- 3 cups cocoa crispy rice cereal (Watch ingredient lists for traces of peanuts or other allergenic foods. At health food stores, it's possible to find dairy-free versions of cocoa crispy rice cereal, but if you can't find any, just use plain crispy rice cereal.)
- 1½ cups finely crushed Oreo cookies—roughly ^{2/3} of a 14.3-ounce package (You can find gluten-free versions of Oreos at stores such as Walmart. Check ingredient lists to be sure. For dairy allergies, look for dairy-free crunchy chocolate cookies or brownie crisps.)
- 2 whole tubes of black gel food coloring (Use whatever amount makes the mixture look truly black.) Instructions:
- Finely crush the Oreo cookies in a large resealable plastic bag. Measure to make sure you have 1½ cups of crushed cookies.
- 2. Put the marshmallows and butter in a large, microwave-safe mixing bowl, and heat in a microwave for 60 to 90 seconds.
- 3. Stir the melted mixture until smooth, and add food coloring until you achieve a black color.
- 4. Incorporate the cocoa crispy rice cereal and crushed Oreos.
- 5. Let the mixture sit and cool for about five minutes.
- 6. Scoop out ¼-cup-size portions onto a large piece of parchment paper. For preschool Crew snacks, scoop out 1/8-cup portions.
- 7. Use another smaller piece of parchment paper held in your hands to shape each portion into a lumpy ball to look like coal.
- 8. Allow all the pieces to cool on sheets of parchment paper for 20 to 30 minutes.
- 9. Then place each piece of finished, cooled Coal Crunch into a resealable plastic bag
