The Sacrament of Holy Communion Invitation

Jesus' gospel is a gospel of love and we who follow him are called to live out that love. Jesus invites us to a meal, a simple meal of bread and wine.

"Come" he says, Come to this table, not because you must but because you may, not because you are strong but because you are weak. Come, not because any goodness of your own gives you the right, but because you need mercy and help. **COME**

The Great Thanksgiving

We thank you Holy One for you gift of creation. We thank you for creating us in your image and declaring that we are good. We bless you that when we turn away from you, you seek us out and offer us the gift of forgiveness. Then you set us on a new path of life and hope.

We remember and give thanks for all the saints: our Mothers and Fathers of faith who shared the gospel with us, The Prophets, Apostles, and martyrs who gave their lives for the gospel.

We thank you that in time, you sent Jesus to live as one of us. He was obedient to your law and your word even to death on a cross. We bless you that death was not the final word for Jesus. You rose him from the grave and he ascended into heaven to remain with you.

We are thankful that you did not abandon us, but that you sent us your Holy Spirit to be our comfort and guide.

And so, we praise you saying,

"Holy, Holy, Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory, Glory be to you, O God Most High"

We remember and tell the story

On the night when Jesus was betrayed, he sat at table with his friends. He took bread blessed it, broke it and gave it to them saying,

"This is my body which is broken for you. Do this as often as you need in remembrance of me."

In the same way after supper, he took a cup and after giving thanks, said,

"This cup is the new covenant which is written in my blood poured out for you and for many. Drink this cup in remembrance of me.

For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim my life, death, and resurrection until I come again."

Therefore, we are bold to say thyme mystery of our faith,

Christ has died.

Christ has risen.

Christ will come again.

Blessing the Elements

Place your hands over the bread and cup and say, this or other prayer:

We thank you O God for the simple gifts of bread and wine. May they nourish our bodies and renew our spirits to serve you until we sit at the heavenly banquet prepared for all your saints.

Let us pray the prayer Jesus taught his disciples.

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. They kingdom come thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. Let us not need to temptation but deliver us from evil for thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

These are the Gifts of God for the people of God. Take them in remembrance of Christ and feed on them in your heart with thanksgiving.
