From the Pastor's Desk

We all have memories from our childhoods. If we're fortunate, we remember fondly family trips, school events, holidays, birthdays, and many things in between. Some of us kept journals or have photo albums we can return to during nostalgic moments in later years. None of our stories start at birth and then stop until we're in our 30s—none of us, that is except for our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We have two gospel accounts of Christ's birth and four filled with details of his ministry, But there is only one story from his childhood that we are privy to, told to us in Matthew 2:19-23 and Luke 2:39-50.

In this story, Jesus is a twelve-year-old boy on a trip to Jerusalem with his family for a Passover feast. When adolescent Jesus lingers after his family has left, they retrace their steps and return to the temple to find him teaching full-grown men! As a mother of young boys, I read this passage and Mary's anxiety leaps off the pages at me. What on earth was Jesus thinking? Perhaps only fellow adolescent boys can fully answer that question. His response is almost a bit too human pre-teen: "Why were you searching for me?" Brave kid, responding to his mother that way! Of course, as much as Jesus is fully human, we know, too, that he is fully divine. In this moment, we see hints of that divinity as he notes there is nothing to worry about because he is, after all, in his Father's house.

His question in many ways echoes the question posed to the women outside the empty tomb: Why

do you search for the living among the dead?" (Luke 24:5). "Why do you search" is a question we all must as ourselves at one point or another in our lives. At first, the answers to these questions seem obvious. Mary searches for Jesus as a mother searches for a lost son. The women search for their loved one the way we all search for loved ones who have passed on from this life to the next. But the question isn't so simple; it begs us to dig deeper: Why do you search?

Throughout our lives of faith, we are presented with big questions that challenge and, if we let them, deepen our faith. Faith, as you know, is a practice developed over time. Faith doesn't just drop from the sky, it's not easy. Faith is not certainty. Faith is more than mere belief. Faith consists of components of both belief and doubt. Faith asks big things of us, just as Jesus does in this passage. Faith requires us to search for wisdom from the deeper well which God has provided. Faith requires us to seek.

Jesus sits with the men in the temple and then before his parents asking tough questions—perhaps the toughest of them all is also the simplest: Why do we search? We have just come through a joyous season and are entering into a new year. As we seek the risen Jesus in the new year, perhaps we will also let Jesus seek, find, and use us for his purposes. Perhaps we will let Jesus "take the wheel" just long enough to open up new roads for our lives, faith, and church community.
