## From the Pastor's Desk

"For you are dust and to dust you shall return." -Genesis 3:19

In the book of Genesis, God reminded the first human that he was made from dust and would one day return to it. On Ash Wednesday, ashes are imposed on our foreheads as we take in those same words and contemplate our own fragility and need for God's saving grace. We are reminded of where we come from so that we may continue to move forward toward redemption.

Lent is a time of contemplation, prayer, fasting, and giving back. It is a time when our faith calls us into deeper relationship with God as we travel with Jesus toward the cross and resurrection. We begin with Ash Wednesday when ritual calls us back to the dust (from) whence we came so that we might begin to unfasten ourselves from the things of this world that keep us at a distance from the Holy One. At that point, many of us choose to give something up, to make a sacrifice by abstaining from something as a form of fasting. In that way, we remember Jesus's sacrifices and fasting for 40 days as he was tempted in the wilderness.

Last year, some of the people in my life made a point of not giving something up for Lent because, they said, "we've given up too much already." For me, this was a misunderstanding of the reasons why we sacrifice for this prescribed period. The things we gave up (and are still giving up, in many cases) to protect one another from catching a potentially deadly virus had a purpose that was different from the Lenten practice, which calls us to fast from something specific and thereby draw us closer to God. Many of my friends instead decided merely to take on a spiritual practice rather than engage in any kind of fasting. I decided to do both.

While I still stand by my assessment of the differences between the enforced "giving up" of the COVID years and the voluntary sacrifice associated with Lent, there is wisdom in taking on spiritual practices during Lent. Ultimately, the purpose of a Lenten sacrifice is to draw us closer to God—and those spiritual practices we took on for 40 days certainly had the same impact.

So, my message to you for this month is that if giving something else up seems too hard for this time in which we live, then I would invite you to take something on. Engage in meditation daily. Learn a new form of prayer (perhaps using Protestant prayer beads). Set aside fresh, dedicated time each day to read scripture or pray the Psalms. Begin to keep a gratitude journal in which you jot down a few things you're thankful for each day. Go for a walk outside every day in God's creation, intentionally engaging in the practice of being present with what God has created (taking note of what you see, hear, and smell). Light a candle each day as you think about those in your life who need prayer. Begin a journal of your spiritual journey. Read a Lenten devotional each day. Join us for a Lenten exploration of Learning to Walk in the Dark. If you aren't currently attending worship, make a commitment to show up for all 6 Sundays of the Lenten journey. Whatever you choose, let it connect you with the Spirit and draw you into deeper connection with the One who created you, sustains you, and who will one day call you home. Onward.

When the temps are 60+ will offer to visit homebound members outside at their homes. Planned and led funeral and graveside service for Alice Hann. Planning a Baptism service for February 27<sup>th</sup>. Developed and kicked off Church-Wide read series (beginning with Bishop Michael Curry's *Love is the Way: Holding onto Hope in Troubling Times*).


## LENTEN BOOK STUDY
