# From the Pastor's Desk:

Why I Wake Early

Hello, sun in my face
Hello, you who made the morning
and spread it over the fields
and into the faces of the tulips
and the nodding morning glories,
and into the windows of, even, the
miserable and the crotchety —

best preacher that ever was,
dear star, that just happens
to be where you are in the universe
to keep us from ever-darkness,
to ease us with warm touching,
to hold us in the great hands of light –
good morning, good morning.

Watch, now, how I start the day in happiness, in kindness.

This month, it felt good and right to begin with the words of poet, Mary Oliver. This message reminds me of the importance of taking notice of the little things that make up our days, the things we so often take for granted, the things we might not even think about if we don't let ourselves be fully present.

Modern technology and human progress have brought many great things into our lives (indoor plumbing, the lightbulb, music on demand, ease of communication, etc). And, at the same time, these advancements in our everyday lives have brought a lot of noise. It can be difficult, if not impossible, to find a quiet moment—literally and figuratively. We fill our days so full and then we arrive home, still not slowing down. If we want to, we can be occupied 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 52 weeks a year.

That's why it's important to listen to the wisdom of the artists who, like Oliver, make the little things their business. In her ode to the sun on the left, she opines on God's work in the creation of all things; we feel her appreciation for the gift of the world that surrounds us, which is in full, blazing bloom as I write this message.

The Psalmist says, "From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the Lord is to be praised" (113:3). In her own way, here, that's exactly what Oliver is doing: expressing gratitude to her Creator for the making of the sun and all that it means for the world we inhabit. Wherever you look, here and beyond, the Divine Presence can be seen, felt, and appreciated in the beauty that all around us.

Autumn will come with its busy-ness and its noise, but for these last few months of summer, let us rejoice in the gift of this season! One way to do that is to join us at Cape Horn Park for our *Mission Dash 5K* (whether you wish to walk it or just hang out and cheer others on) as we walk in the splendor of the natural world, brought forth and blessed by God, then entrusted to our care. Details later in the newsletter. Whether you join us or not, let us all remember to be good and faithful stewards of this most precious gift.



Let's say on a monthly basis I purchase the following cards. These will be used to pay for groceries, gasoline, prescriptions and health products, and household items.

Let's assume we have 20 family units willing to purchase gift cards on a monthly basis.  $$198 \times 20 = $3,960$  that TUCC could raise in 1 year with no effort. I know everyone does not spend \$400 a month on food, gas and supplies but even at \$200 a month we would be close to \$2,000.
