From the Pastor's Desk:

By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread until you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust, and to dust you shall return. -Genesis 3:19

It's that time of year again, dear ones: time for our reflective Lenten journey to begin. On Ash Wednesday, ashes are imposed on our foreheads as we listen to those words and contemplate our own human finitude and fragility, reminded of our need for God's saving grace.

As I wrote last year at this time, "Lent is a time of contemplation, prayer, fasting, and giving back. It is a time when our faith calls us into deeper relationship with God as we travel with Jesus toward the cross and resurrection." The ritual at its beginning calls us back to our creation and looks toward our future—a prompt to unhook ourselves from the things of this world that put us at a distance from our God.

As we journey together, we remember Jesus's sacrifices and fasting for 40 days as he was tempted in the wilderness. Many of us give something up for those 40 days. Curiously, Lent is longer than 40 days. 46 to be exact. Sundays do not count in our Lenten observation because Sundays are *always* "little Easter." They are not technically counted in our 40-day fast – so, if you give up chocolate for Lent, for instance, you could have a small piece on Sunday and not be breaking your Lenten fast. Each of us must weigh how we feel about how that may impact our

Lenten journey and decide whether to keep our fast on "little Easter" or not.

During Lent, our worship even gives something up: the word "Hallelujah." There will be no such utterances after Transfiguration Sunday (February 19), until we reach the bright shining glory of Easter morning. This much beloved Hebrew liturgical expression (spelled "alleluia" in the Greek) translates essentially as "praise the Lord." Why wouldn't we say "praise the Lord" during lent? This practice really goes back to the importance of emphasizing the penitential nature of the Lenten season. We are called to look inward at our where we have transgressed and fallen short of our calling as God's beloved children. Singing glory to God with choirs of angels carries with it a celebratory tone we, naturally, don't engage in during a season of reflection, repentance, seeking, and prayer.

What, if anything, will you give up for Lent? What practices might you take on? Maybe you will give up an indulgence that draws your attention from God to draw deeper into prayer and scriptural reflection. Maybe you will begin a meditation practice or lectio divina. Maybe it's time for a social media detox because you can think of no better time to give up toxicity in your life than Lent.

Whatever it is, may your Lenten observance be meaningful and may the Holy One who made you, loves you, and provides for you guide you ever nearer to the grace and mercy only God can give.
