From the Pastor's Desk:

"There can be no renewal of our relationship with nature without a renewal of humanity itself." -- Pope Francis

Spring is officially here! The flowers are blooming. Birds are chirping. Rain or sun, spring is a joyous time with more hours of sunlight and a renewed sense of hope that the dreary winter months have finally passed us by.

We're also approaching the renewal of our faith on the liturgical calendar in the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday. This Lenten season, we explored some themes of our faith and how those can resonate through our culture (as in the case of *Les Misérables*). But we have also looked deeply at what those themes mean for how we act as people of faith.

As we approach the joy of Easter morning, we also recognize that our time together as pastor and congregation is nearing its close (though we aren't there just yet!). This can be a challenging time for pastor and people, but I have seen such love and care shown toward my family and myself that it is my great hope that not only will this time pass more easily than it might for some churches, but that it will ultimately be a blessing to us all. We are not a church moving into a new era because things are not going well, but because of blessings already bestowed and ones yet to come. Let us be of good cheer and of great joy as we look toward what's to come, even when uncertainty provokes a little anxiety. We can be assured that we aren't doing this alone.

That's why I have chosen to honor our last 8 weeks together (beginning on the Third Sunday of Easter, April 23rd) with a worship series that revolves around the Fruit of the Spirit.

According to Paul in his letter to the Galatian church, "the fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness/generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." He contrasts this fruit with the works of the flesh, which include all the usual suspects that can drive our failings as human beings. Paul calls upon us as Christians not just to live by the spirit, but also to be guided by it—manifesting the fruit in our dealings with the other parts of God's good creation.

Often, we think about our Christian calling primarily in relation to how we work with God and with people. This spring, as you witness all the signs of new life around you and as you participate in Spirit-centered worship, I hope you will feel encouraged to manifest the fruit of the Spirit in your dealings with the rest of the natural world. All of God's creation are part of our good stewardship: from the animals that walk, swim, and fly, to the plants blooming and flowering everywhere, to the water which flows and sustains us. These gifts from God above are often honored in April for Earth Day, but we must remember to care for what God has graciously provided not just during humankind's "holidays," but all year round. Renewal is not a one-time event, it is a perpetual calling, a practice, and a gift.



Food Bags for Backpacks & Snack Packs for Classrooms

While our food bag and snack pack mission with Manchester Elementary School may not be as visible as other programs in our community, it is certainly just as important. Studies indicate that one in six children in the United States do not get enough to eat. The food bags program gives selected students in the FARM program (free and reduced meal) 12 food items each month to take home to supplement the family diet, while the snack packs program provides snacks in each classroom to be available for any child who may need an additional snack during the school day. The cost of the food bags program is about \$140 per month and the cost of the snack packs program is about \$150 per month. Each month we provide 300 items with the food bags program and about 400 items with the snack packs program.
