From the Pastor's Desk:

Nothing is impossible.
The word itself says, 'I'm possible!'
-Audrey Hepburn

This month, I am thinking about the ways in which God's Spirit, which resides within us, shows up. Paul had an idea of what it looks like when we are living according to the Spirit. He believed that when we put God first in all we do we manifest good fruit shining through in how we live.

Fundamentally, those attributes work (told in (Gal. 5:22-23) work together to form the Fruit of the Spirit (singular), not fruits (plural), as is often incorrectly said. This is key to consider as we begin our last series together, during which we will discuss how they live within as beloved children of God. We aren't imbued with just one or two of these, though some of them may be more evident in our words and behaviors than others.

Looking through Paul's list, it might seem as if all these cannot possibly exist in us at the same time. As the angel said to Mary in Luke 1:37, "*But with God, nothing is impossible.*" Or, if you prefer a non-scriptural reference, see Audrey Hepburn's "I'm possible" quote above.

All things are possible. Yet, we are human, so there are moments when we have more patience than others or are more loving or kind. We might fail the test of faithfulness in our dealings with people or lack joy because of what's happening around us. Though the perfection of God's Spirit lives within us, we are still imperfectly human. I hope it is a relief to know that God knows this,

too. If God did not create us to be perfect beings, God certainly isn't expecting us to manifest God's perfection (that's not a characteristic of the Fruit of the Spirit, after all).

Even so, we must try to live more closely into the call to follow in Christ's footsteps. We know what that looks like because we've got four gospels (plus!), which give us examples. It's tempting to give into our worst instincts when all seems to be going awry or when life gets especially hectic. There were certainly moments when Jesus seemed to get frustrated or overwhelmed with what happened around him (flipping tables, anyone?).

When we think we don't have time for faithfulness, or for being kind or loving or patient or controlled; when we want to be anything but good, gentle, joyful, or peaceful—those are the moments we need to lean into the Spirit most. If you're having a hard time, there is no better cure than to make things easier for others. The fruit of the Spirit is contagious! It is what has kept The Way of Jesus alive and spreading for millennia. To receive good things, we must be willing to give them.

This month, I challenge you all to find little ways to manifest the fruit of the Spirit every day. Make a note of those moments and share them with one another that we all can be encouraged by the ways in which the Spirit is shining through you and into the world!

Food Bags for Backpacks & Snack

While our food bag and snack pack mission with Manchester Elementary School may not be as visible as other programs in our community, it is certainly just as important. Studies indicate that one in six children in the United States do not get enough to eat. The food bags program gives selected students in the FARM program (free and reduced meal) 12 food items each month to take home to supplement the family diet, while the snack packs program provides snacks in each classroom to be available for any child who may need an additional snack during the school day. The cost of the food bags program is about \$140 per month and the cost of the snack packs program is about \$150 per month. Each month we provide 300 items with the food bags program and about 400 items with the snack packs program.

The month of May will be the last month for these programs during this school year, but with your continued support we hope to begin again this coming September.
