### From the Pastor's Desk:

"How lucky I am to have something that makes saying goodbye so hard."

-A.A. Milne

This month, unsurprisingly, I am thinking about beginnings and endings—about what they mean and about how we do them.

Beginnings are usually fun. They're exciting. They are full of hope and possibility. We like beginnings because they imply the opportunity for positive change that can lead to new ways of living, working, or being.

Endings are typically hard. They are characterized by reflection and sorrow. We don't usually like endings because they mean saying goodbye to the familiar and entail changes in the way we relate to people or things. They're even more painful when the thing that is ending has been fundamentally good.

Beginnings and endings are a necessary, if challenging, part of life.

I'm once again drawn to the text from Ecclesiastes that became part of a very famous song from by Pete Seeger:

"To everything there is a season and a time to every purpose under heaven... a time to break down and a time to build up; a time to weep and a time to dance." – from Eccl. 3:1-4

Yes, there is a season for all things. Some seasons are long and some are not. As I reflect on my time as your pastor, the time feels both long and short. I feel my family have become an integral part of this community and we do not

relish leaving behind familiar faces and the loving, open hearts of everyone in this community.

And, at the same time, the time has felt far too short. There is more work and celebration in store for Trinity and I would have loved being a part of all of that.

But, God, it seems, has other plans for us and for you. In Winnie the Pooh, A.A. Milne wrote the quote at the beginning of this column, one that has been on my heart since I wrote the pastoral letter announcing my resignation. How lucky I truly am to have served this community formed around the love of God and the love of others. How lucky I truly am to have worked and visited, laughed and grieved alongside you. How lucky I truly am that, even our family's dreams come to fruition "across the pond," I feel a very real tug at my heart directly in the direction of 3229 York Street. Saying goodbye is hard because our time together really has been good.

The book of Ecclesiastes reminds us, however, that amidst this big ending and the tears that accompany it, is the guiding hand of God, who never abandons us even as we are tossed about in the waves of life's overwhelming ocean. There is a season for everything, but there is also a purpose and for that purpose, we give thanks.

Our celebrations together these two years may be ending, but our service—to God, to one another, and to the world—continues. Go forward always in hope, in love, and in peace.
