#### From the Pastor's Desk:

O give thanks to the Lord, for God is good; for God's steadfast love endures forever.

Psalm 106:1

When each new season breaks forth, I think: "I love this time of year!" I love the promise of snow, the spring flowers and the summer sun. And I love autumn. Soon the leaves will be changing – their leaves shining in bright yellows, reds and oranges. As they fall to the ground, we will feel the crispness of the frost. Already yards are decorated with pumpkins and scarecrows. The ever-changing nature of life surrounds us. You can feel it in the air.

This season is beautiful to see -- at least for those of us who watch from a distance and aren't falling from the trees ourselves! This life-altering change isn't all that terrifying for those of us who have witnessed it before. Like those who have gone before us, we need to remember and give thanks even as we cry out for God's help, so that we can move forward in faith.

The Wind is coaxing us to entrust ourselves to the God who holds us and the future in God's hands. The Voice of God is calling us to step forward with faith. 


# Food Bags for Backpacks & Snack Packs for Classrooms


As a sign of our thanks to God, we ask that you bring a non-perishable food item and place it on the altar.
