#### **December 2023 Consistory Meeting Highlights**

**Treasurer's report:** Sue advised looking pretty good. First page of her report shows investments went up. The actual rain gutter repair cost was \$1,800.00 less than the original \$3,100.00 estimate, Sue will be returning the extra \$1,800.00 to the insurance company. She has spent \$26,000.00 from the endowment and needs an additional \$5,000.00 during December.

**Pastor Report:** Stewardship Sunday (now called Generosity Sunday) is scheduled for November 12<sup>th</sup> and kicked off "A Year of Generosity." Each month, a different person will be asked to talk to the church for a few minutes about how Trinity has changed their lives.

On November 19<sup>th</sup>, we remembered those who had passed away over the last year..

Pastor Katie continued to connect with members

through phone and home visits. Home communion can be offered to anyone who would like it.

The Crossroads group continues to move forward. One issue that emerged out of our Crossroads group is a desire to explore the ONA process. Pastor Katie also attended meetings for the Carroll County Ministerium, Communities of Practice, CAC Board of Directors: and the Catoctin Association Council.

On 12/10/23 we held our annual budget meeting, and the budget passed. Now, going forward, we ask that everyone be prayerful in giving of their time, talents and finances. Those three will help us continue fulfilling our commitment to community.



#### **COMMITMENT TO COMMUNITY**

This Advent season we had the opportunity to show our commitment to community locally and not-so-local. In addition to our regular Giving Tree for a NESAP family, we collected canned goods through our reverse Advent calendar project that are being donated to NESAP, as well as a small monetary donation.

We also had the opportunity to participate with 3 other congregations to provide gift cards to the Job Corps program in Harpers Ferry, WV. The program provides training, housing, education, medical care, etc for low income youth, ages 16 - 24. On December 18, 2023, Pastor Katie Penick, Pastor Marty Kuchma (St. Paul's UCC) and myself delivered 31 Amazon gift cards which will be used in various ways. While most students were able to go "home" for Christmas, others were not. These students will be given gift cards as a way to show they are valued and not forgotten. The remaining gift cards will be used to provide needed supplies, clothing, etc. What a blessing to be able to be a part of this!

#### **ONA: BUILDING AN INCLUSIVE CHURCH!**

On Sunday December 10, Pastor Katie, Hannah Matthews, Leslie Brooks, Pam Marchand, and MB Brainerd met after worship for soup and conversation, to begin the journey of the ONA (Open 'N Affirming) discernment process for Trinity UCC in Manchester! Lucy Brady, Moriah Marr, and Amy Schultz were not able to attend this first meeting, but they were with us in spirit, and plan to join the core planning team. If anyone else would like to be part of the core planning

team, please speak to anyone of the team members.

In the ONA discernment process, we as a church will engage together in "grace-filled" conversations about how we can become a more inclusive church, and, in doing so, deepen our faith and expand our welcome to people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions. As we move through the Winter into Spring, the core team will be engaging in 1:1 conversation with church members as well as planning numerous opportunities for the entire church to practice "grace-filled engagement," in which each person is treated as a beloved child of God, and we come to a renewed understanding of whom we are called to be, as the body of Christ. ONA discernment is a journey, that continues even beyond deciding, as a church, whether we will covenant with other welcoming churches, publicly covenanting to being a church that welcomes and loves everyone, without exception.
