From the Pastor's Desk:



Beloved,

What does it mean to be an Open and Affirming (ONA) Church? We are a few months into this process and some people in our congregation wonder why we are doing this. "Aren't we already a welcoming church... haven't' we already shown that we love one another?"

And the answer is yes, we are... and that is why we are doing this. LGBTQ+* people of faith and their families often experience emotional and spiritual injury in churches that condemn their capacity to love and seek love. Too many have learned the hard way that "All Are Welcome" doesn't always apply to them, LGBTQ+ folks can't assume that every church will be safe for them and their families, and they look for places that will intentionally welcome them with arms wide open.

A pastor I know serves a church with a "Be the Church" banner hanging on the outside wall. This banner has a rainbow background and is often displayed at ONA churches. One day, a man walked into the church office and asked to speak to the pastor. "I have been walking my dog by your church for years and I've noticed your banner. Last week my husband of 40 years died and I'm feeling so alone yet seeing your banner told me that this must be a safe place for me to be."

A Safe Place to Be – That is what it means to be an Open and Affirming Church. Over the next year, our Core Team will meet monthly to explore what it means to be ONA. Eventually these discussions will expand to include the entire church. When we publicly declare that we are Open and Affirming... when we open up our arms and say that yes, you really are welcome here, no questions asked... then we have become a safe place to be: a Sanctuary.

Accept one another, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God. Romans 15:7

* LGBTQ+ is a shorthand for "lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer/questioning." The word "queer" has often been adopted by people who don't want to be constrained by the identities of lesbian, gay, bisexual, or transgender. The plus symbol reflects the diversity of sexual and gender identities in the human family.





TUCC Exploring Partnership with Charlotte's Quest: The UCC 3 Great Loves

<u>The 3 Great Loves</u> of the United Church of Christ: Love of neighbor, love of children, and love of creation all come together in a new partnership with Charlotte's Quest (CQ) that the TUCC Crossroads team is exploring this Spring. Pastor Katie and MB Brainerd attended the January CQ Board meeting to learn more about what intergenerational activities we might share and co-sponsor. Opportunities for connecting with CQ include weekly monitoring of the CQ Bluebird Bird Houses for nesting activity, doing ground-testing of a cave, which could lead to further exploration, led by Ashby Haines, and star-watching the night sky using the telescopes at the CQ Star Shed. Also, we hope to start a walking group that will walk from TUCC to the CQ Nature Center, possibly connecting with the CQ bluebird monitoring initiative. If you are interested in being part of this intergenerational TUCC Love of Creation initiative, speak with Pastor Katie or MB Brainerd.
