From the Pastor's Desk:

As I write this, we are in the uncertain days after the military strike against Iran. Our community prays for peace each week, but the pursuit of peace can feel overwhelming in a world filled with conflict and uncertainty. The news is filled with stories of division and turmoil throughout our country and our world. You may wonder if true peace is possible. Yet, as, Christian, we have the promise of peace in Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace.

The Bible reminds us that Jesus offers a peace unlike the world's peace. This peace surpasses understanding and can protect hearts and minds during life's challenges. It comes from trusting in God's plan for a hopeful future and the assurance that God is with us in the present.

How can individuals and the church community be instruments of God's peace in the world?

The call to be peacemakers is central to the Christian faith. The Sermon on the Mount pushes us into actively seeking harmony and reconciliation.

We cultivate peace in lives and communities when we:

- Embrace love and compassion through kindness, empathy, and respect to all. We recognize that all are created in God's image.
- Practice forgiveness and reconciliation to mend broken relationships, mirroring God's work through Christ.
- Pray for peace and justice in a world where God's justice prevails. Prayer is a powerful spiritual tool.
- Live with humility by recognizing limitations and valuing others, seeking common ground and working together towards peace.
- Become peace bearers who promote social justice, human rights, and diplomacy among nations and communities.
- Be a voice for the oppressed by speaking out against injustice and advocating for the rights and wellbeing of the vulnerable.

Building peace requires actions motivated by love and faith. We are called by Christ to be ambassadors of peace, spreading God's love and hope and working towards a world where peace and justice prevail for all.

Let's join together in prayer for peace:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace: where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy.

Bluebird monitors, once per week, March – September, observe and document the Bluebird activity at one or more assigned Bluebird houses. So far Sam & MB have observed Bluebirds, Chickadees, and Tree Swallows build their nests, lay their eggs, and fledge their chicks. Hannah & Annika also have seen 3 Bluebird chicks in one of their assigned bluebird boxes.
