#### From the Pastor's Desk:

I love to tell the story
Of unseen things above,
Of Jesus and His glory,
Of Jesus and His love.

Our faith is built on stories. The stories of those who came before us and the stories of our own lives. We meet God in our stories.

When I was a little girl, my family bought an ancient houseboat. We spent long lazy summer vacations on that old boat, often anchored to a sandbar on the Mississippi River. One trip, the current was very strong, and my friend and I were told to stay in the shallow waters unless an adult was with us. We did, but the current was stronger than anyone realized, and it swept me away. I heard my friend call out for my father as I raced by the boat. Suddenly, my father's strong hands surrounded me and pulled me to safety. I don't remember my own baptism, but I will always remember the muddy baptismal waters of the Mississippi when I was saved by my father who loved me so much.

And that story informs my faith of love and salvation. We meet God in our stories.

We meet God in the Shepherd who leaves his large flock to find the one lost and frightened little sheep. We meet God in an elderly woman who gets down on her hands and knees, desperately looking for that one lost coin. And, we meet God again in the parable of the Prodigal son, when Jesus tells the story of a father who watched his son walk away with his inheritance and squander it in a distant land. This father waits patiently for his child to experience the consequences of his actions and return, and "While he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion."

What are the stories that inform your faith? Where do you meet God? When we gather them all together, a vibrant quilt of stories and events that move and change us, we will help bring about God's Beloved Community. May it be so!

Charlotte's Quest has Bluebirds!! And flying squirrels!!

Hannah & Annika Matthews, and Sam & MB Brainerd are official volunteer Bluebird House monitors at Charlotte's Quest Nature Center, as part of the Eastern Bluebird Monitoring Project 2025! Bluebird monitors, once per week, March -September, observe and document the Bluebird activity at one or more assigned Bluebird houses. So far Sam & MB have observed Bluebirds. Chickadees, and Tree Swallows build their nests, lay their eggs, and fledge their chicks. Hannah & Annika also have seen 3 Bluebird chicks in one of their assigned bluebird boxes. And last week Hannah & Annika saw flying squirrel nests in two of the boxes they checked! If you are interested in monitoring Bluebird boxes at Charlotte's Quest, contact either Hannah or MB!

The CCIARJ is holding its second annual potluck on Saturday October 4<sup>th</sup> at the Grace Lutheran Church – everyone in the Trinity UCC community is invited to attend – speak with Pastor Katie or MB Brainerd if you are interested in learning more!!

Also the CCIARJ is planning a 6-hour nonviolence resistance and organizing training for member communities on Saturday November 8 – the training, limited to 30 participants, will be conducted by Dr. Pam Zapardino and Dr. Charlie Collyer, co-directors of the Ira & Mary Zepp Center for Nonviolence and Peace Education, which is a program of Common Ground on the Hill, a Maryland Folklife Center, in Residence at McDaniel College. Pam and Charlie have agreed to customize the training, which follows the Kingian school of resistance training and organizing, to be inclusive of what the faith traditions represented in the CCIARJ say about peace, justice, and nonviolence.

## Tioga County, Pennsylvania October 5-10, 2025

Tioga County, Pennsylvania, was particularly hard hit by flooding triggered by the remnants of Tropical Storm Debby in August of 2024. Some of those affected areas were also drenched by the leftovers of Tropical Storm Fred in August 2021 and took months to recover. An economically challenged area of the county was hard hit by both storms.

Our partner for our work week is Develop Tioga, a local organization that has formed a Long-Term Recovery team continuing to work with those impacted by the flooding and wants to ensure that anybody still in need of assistance is considered for help.

The recovery work has been focused on cleaning up debris from properties and repairing homes that were devastated by flooding. Previous groups have been doing work such as installing water heaters, drywall, replacing insulation, and building ramps.

As we get closer to the time of the trip and know the skills of the group members, we will be able to have a clearer idea of what our group will be doing.

We will need people with a variety of skills as well as people who are willing to learn new skills, cook, and do material runs for the group. In other words, we will find meaningful work for you to do.

Group Size: Up to 20

Cost: approximately \$100 per person for food. As of right now, the group will be cooking at a local church. One dinner out at your own expense.

Accommodations: Penn York Camp (as of today). Participants will need to bring sleeping bags or bedding.

**Schedule:** Participants arrive late afternoon/early evening on October 5th. We can arrange for the carpooling once we know who is going.
