From the Pastor's Desk:

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among the people, to make music in the heart. (Howard Thurman)

The story of Christmas is not just a quaint tale of a baby in a manger; it is a radical affirmation of God's presence in the most unexpected and vulnerable places. The true spirit of the season calls us to action. The heart of the Christmas message is that the Incarnation brought the divine to be present in *all* of life, especially in our shared humanity and our call to justice.

This year, let us take the words of Howard Thurman to heart: "The work of Christmas begins" when we leave the comfort of our worship spaces.

To find the lost: Reaching out to those marginalized by society, ensuring everyone has a home and a family within our community and beyond.

To heal the broken: Advocating for mental health resources, supporting one another through grief, and working for a world where all can find wholeness.

To feed the hungry: Engaging in the Reverse Advent mission and addressing the systemic issues that cause food insecurity.

To release the prisoner: Reflecting on justice and mercy, working for a more equitable judicial system.

To rebuild the nations: Promoting peace, understanding, and collaboration across communities and the globe.

To bring peace among people: Fostering difficult conversations with grace and a commitment to shared human dignity.

To make music in the heart: Cultivating joy, gratitude, and wonder, and recognizing the simple sweetness and goodness of life that points to the divine.

The Christmas story reminds us that God chooses to be "with us"—Emmanuel—in the flesh and blood of our daily lives. The challenge, and the blessing, is to carry that love and light into a world that still knows darkness. May we all strive to make God's justice roll down like never-ending waters, not just at Christmas, but in every season. May your Christmas be filled with blessings! *Pastor Katie*

On Wed October 29th, the Carroll County Health Department mobile health clinic came to Trinity's south parking lot to distribute bags filled with integrated health resource info for services available across Carroll County, as well as assorted health paraphanelia to the community residents waiting in line for the Wed morning food distribution at Immanuel Lutheran Church. Health services and information resources range from getting Flu Vaccine (provide insurance info and ID), Respiratory Illness Prevention, Blood Pressure screening, Naloxone training & distribution to prevent death from Opioid overdose, STI Screening, HIV & Hep C Testing. The next mobile health clinic will be sometime in early 2026 when we expect that the mobile unit will also be here, with clinicians available to provide services. We'll keep you informed!! The Carroll County Interfaith Alliance for Racial Justice (CCIARJ) is planning a free 3-hour FOLLOW UP nonviolence resistance and organizing training on Saturday January 24, 1-4p.m. It will be held at the Exploration Commons

at 50 East, Westminster Branch of CCPL, 50 E. Main Street, Westminster. Those who have not yet attended the introductory training can still attend the "follow up" so long as they complete some foundational reading and/or watch an introductory video.

The Nonviolence Resistance training, limited to 50 participants, will be conducted by Dr. Pam Zapardino and Dr. Charlie Collyer, codirectors of the Common Ground on the Hill "Ira & Mary Zepp Center for Nonviolence and Peace Education." Pam and Charlie are fully certified trainers following the Kingian school of resistance training and organizing, which combines the principles of Peace, Nonviolence, and Justice.


