From the Pastor's Desk:

*"The Lord is close to the brokenhearted
and saves those who are crushed in spirit." (Psalm 34:18)*

As I write this, I am surrounded by coverage of the latest violent shooting in Minneapolis. It seems as if each day brings more bad news and hardship. The world feels like it's shifting beneath our feet. The news is heavy and our own burdens feel like they might tip the scales, the answer rarely comes in a grand gesture or a loud proclamation. It comes in the quiet, radical practice of love.

Our faith reminds us that the darker the night, the brighter a single candle shines. If you are feeling overwhelmed by the weight of the world right now, remember that you do not have to carry it alone.

Love is the light that the darkness cannot overcome. It is the soup brought to a sick friend, the grace given to a tired spouse, and the prayer whispered in the middle of the night. We show love when we respond to one another with empathy, patience and kindness. We show love when we respond to one another as Jesus responds to us. As we navigate these days, let us cling to the promise of Romans 8:38-39: nothing—no trouble, no hardship, no power—can separate us from the love of God.

In 1 John 4:18, we are reminded that "perfect love drives out fear." This doesn't mean the world becomes less scary; it means that our response to the world changes. Love in troubled times isn't just a feeling—it is a decision to be the "calm in the storm" for someone else. Whether it's a phone call to a lonely neighbor or a patient word during a tense conversation, these small acts are the threads that hold our community together.

This month, let us look for the "quiet opportunities." Let us be the evidence of God's love that our neighbors are looking for.


Bible Study

A new Bible Study is beginning soon, with our first session on **Thursday, February 5th at 6:30 PM**, meeting both in person and remotely. This study will explore some of the earliest, pre-orthodox layers of Christianity by focusing on Marcion, a figure long labeled a heretic but increasingly recognized by modern scholars as the first person to assemble a structured Christian collection of scriptures. Rather than creating new writings, Marcion selected and arranged texts he believed preserved the authentic message of Jesus and Paul. His canon—the *Evangelion*, a single gospel representing an early form of Luke, and the *Apostolicon*, a set of ten Pauline letters—is the earliest organized Christian scripture known to history. Many scholars argue that later, proto-orthodox versions of Luke and the Pauline letters show expansions when compared with the forms Marcion used. The text we'll be using for the study is *The First New Testament: Marcion's Scriptural Canon* by Jason D. BeDuhn, which provides a scholarly reconstruction of Marcion's scripture.

We'll be reading this reconstruction directly, letting Marcion's *Evangelion* and *Apostolicon* speak for themselves without being filtered through later theological interpretations. While the focus of the study is on Marcion's own texts, our first session will briefly explore the path that leads to him—from Jesus and the Essenes, through Middle Platonism and Paul, and ultimately to Marcion's place within these early, pre-orthodox layers of the tradition. As part of that background, we will also take a brief look at the five major “orthodox hijacks,” moments when religious institutions backed by imperial powers reshaped earlier spiritual traditions—so we can better understand the historical pressures that shaped early Christianity and Judaism. This foundation will help us understand the religious world in which Marcion worked and the earlier traditions he drew from, so that as we read his texts, we can recognize the spiritual currents that shaped them and the historical forces that set the stage for his bold vision of the gospel.


